Democratic Republic of The Congo (DRC) A huge population of 106 million, spread over a large land mass, Adolescent boys choose between fighting in the civil war or leaving to find work. CAFOD with its local partner, Cajed, finances projects to support health, schools and training

schemes to teach trades. (Please note the Catholic Church is the only agency able to work in some areas.)

 Example - Daniel had a poor education and needed work. He attended a training centre in Goma which teaches trades in Carpentry, mushroom farming and tailoring. Daniel is a carpenter with his own workshop and a future, making doors, and simple tables and chairs.

Sudan Crisis appeal – At the start of the appeal, millions were forced to leave their homes and at least 25 million needed emergency help . CAFOD immediately gave over \pounds 1 million and currently are working with over 400,000 South Sudanese refugees to resettle them into communities with large numbers of internally displaced people, for example in White Nile. Projects involve sanitation, hygiene, providing household items, such as cooking utensils and blankets. Local partners also address livelihoods, including giving cash vouchers.

General work in Caribbean, Central America, Latin America and Brazil

- tackle poverty both in urban and rural areas
- create more peaceful and just societies
- protect the environment
- support women, young people and indigenous groups to have more say in political and economic life
- respond to emergencies such as hurricanes, floods, earthquakes and armed conflict.
